**Demonstration Bicycle Helmet**

By using an egg with a demonstration expanded polystyrene bicycle helmet teachers can show students why it is important to always wear a bicycle helmet.

**The Right Way or No Way**

Aimed specifically at children in years 5, 6 and 7 (9 – 12 years) "The Right Way or No Way" covers a range of different roads and depicts 'real life' scenarios that have been identified as posing the most risk to children who are accessing the high-speed road network, (produced by the Highways Agency).

**Life's a Journey**

A brand new multi media interactive DVD resource for 12 – 14 year olds. This resource addresses road safety and citizenship issues through English, PSHE and Drama. The resource consists of three filmed scenarios looking at the transition period when students are beginning to make Independent Journeys to and from school.
