Background

School Streets and street openings are an effective way to create child friendly cities and neighborhoods. However, it is not always easy to consult the different stakeholders involved, and plan for these interventions so that they have wider impact.

Carolyn Ireland from Southampton City Council, **Jenny Babey** from Sustrans and **Dr. Alan Wong** from the University of Southampton will outline some of the tools used to consult a range of stakeholders, which can include children and young people, local residents and other community groups.

This webinar will provide practical guidance on how to plan, consult and implement child-friendly street trials, as well as encourage local residents to engage and take ideas forward, with the support of local policy makers at the City Council.
