Keeping entertained on your daily outings:

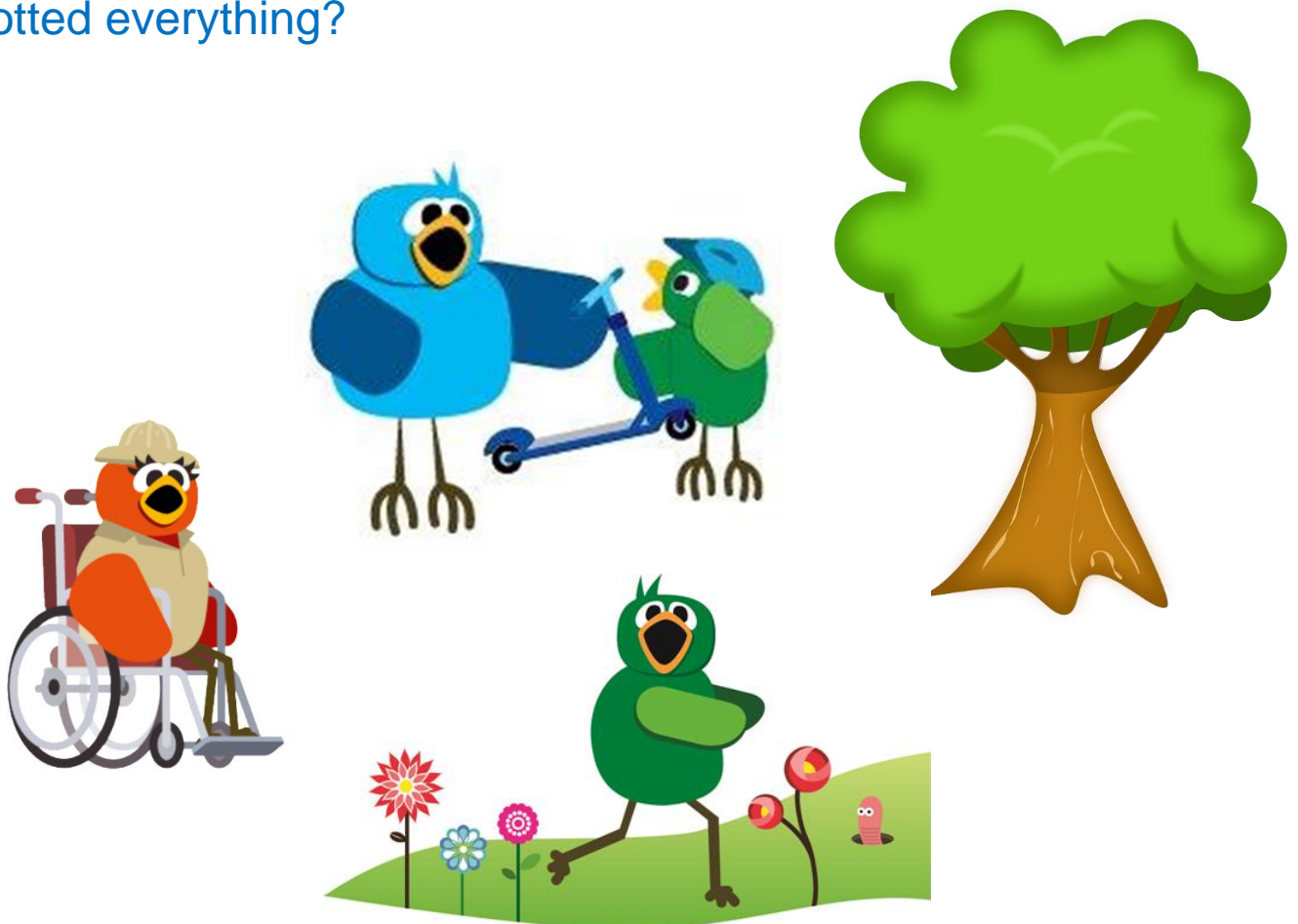
Urban Scavenger Hunt

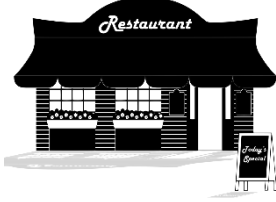



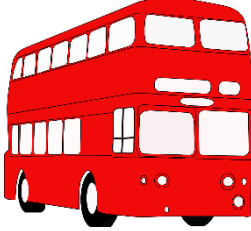
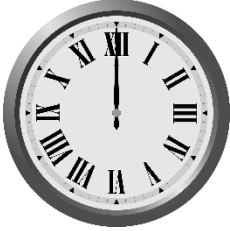








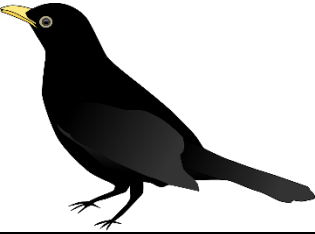
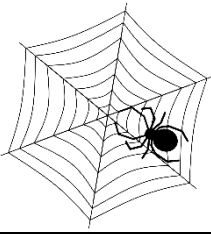


Take a pencil along and, when you have seen the item, tick the box underneath the picture.
