Once they have mastered this, they are ready to move on to pedalling independently The sessions are always in demand and with a little perseverance and hard work the majority of children very quickly become confident at pedalling on their own.

> The Cycle Skills sessions are designed for those who are already pedalling confidently. Children can then learn new skills that will help them to become confident cyclists and helps prepare them for Bikeability at school, which they usually do in year 5 or 6.

They are taught how to be observant on a bike by looking behind and around them, to cycle while signalling and how to navigate obstacles. The sessions always finish with a fun skills course to put it all into practice.

Around 70% of children learnt to pedal independently
