**Walking for Health**

Short, safe and sociable walks in your local area. East Hampshire Walking for Health is free to attend and suitable for people of all abilities, from beginners to more experienced walkers. All walks are led by trained walk leaders who are there to offer information and support on the walk.

**The Wayfarers Walk**

The Wayfarers Walk extends 70 miles between the coast near Portsmouth and Inkpen Beacon just across the Berkshire border. It connects with other long distance paths at Emsworth (the Sussex Border Path), at Bedhampton (the Solent Way) and at Inkpen Beacon (the Test Way).

On the way it passes through a series of towns and picturesque villages. It is an interesting walk; the start is high, with imposing views north whilst the end is a pleasant stroll along the coast past the northern end of Hayling Island.

**The Solent Way**

The Solent Way is a 60-mile long-distance coastal walking route from the seaside town of Milford-on-Sea past the hustle and bustle of seafronts, quiet yachting harbours, deserted marshland and saltings to finish at Emsworth Harbour.

The Way has been divided into 8 sections, each providing a really good day out. Choose between deserted coastal marshes or promenades and candy-floss, seaside picnics or cosy riverside pubs, and shingle beaches with exhilarating views.

There are castles and forts to explore, ships, submarines and museums to visit - and always with the smell and sound of the sea beside you. Walk past some of the finest marshes and lagoons in the south.

**Public Transport - Train**

Emsworth rail station, located on North Street, is well connected, with services to London Victoria, Brighton, Portsmouth and Southampton.

The standard off-peak service consists of four trains per hour in each direction - one between Brighton and Southampton, one between Brighton and Portsmouth Harbour, one between

Littlehampton and Portsmouth & Southsea and one between London Victoria and Southampton.

**Call & Go Bus Service Havant**

**Who can use it?**  
Anyone whose travel needs are not met by local bus services can use Call & Go. This might be because there are no bus services, you live too far away from a bus stop or you find it difficult getting on and off public buses.

**Where can I go?**  
The service can pick you up from home for travel anywhere in the borough of Havant plus Horndean, Clanfield and Rowlands Castle. The service operates on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Fridays.

**What can I do?**  
You can use the service to get to the shops, health services, leisure centres or visit friends and relatives. You can even travel into Portsmouth on Tuesdays.

**How much does it cost?**  
Fares are similar to normal bus services. Concessionary bus pass holders can travel for half price.

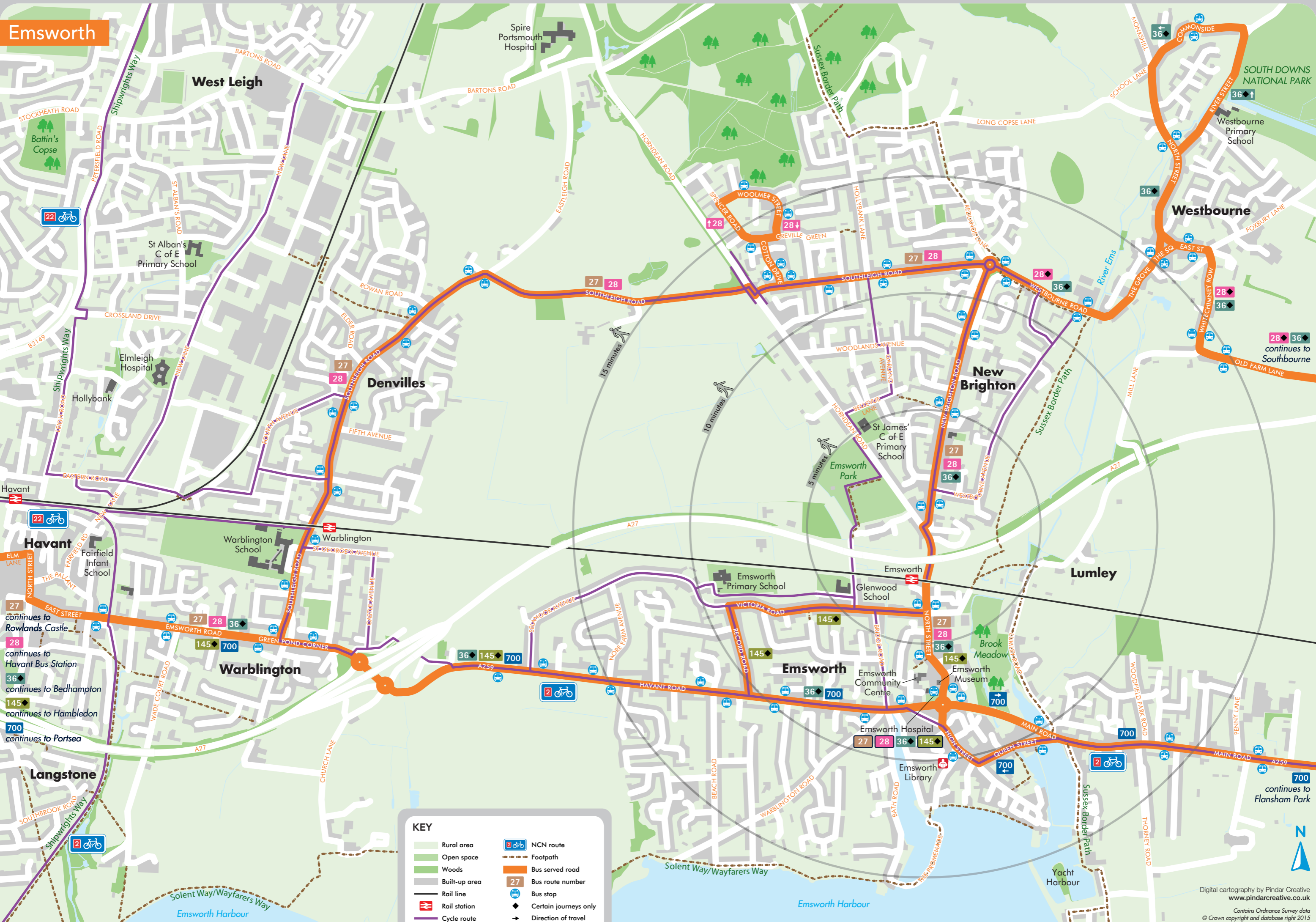
